RECORDED MUSIC

Here are some names to look for (on-line ordering, or independent record stores are best)

- 1. Early recordings 1920s Dave Tarras, Naftule Brandwein Clarinet, Abe Schwartz Violin
- 2. 1930s-`50s eg Klezmer Plus, Epstein Brothers, Shloime Beckerman, Sam Musiker
- 3. 1970s Klezmer revival bands , Kapelye, Klezmer Conservatory Band, (The Klezmorim), Andy Statman,
- 4. **Contemporised Klezmer**; often including fusion with jazz, rock, "av ant-garde" other world music styles. Klezmatics, Finjan, Flying Bulgar Klezmer Band, Don Byron, Salomon Klezmorim, Dave Krakauer
- 5. **New European Roots / Old World "revisited"** : Budowitz, Brave Old World (earlier material), Di Naye Kapelye (Hungary) Chicago Klezmer Ensemble, Alicia Svigals (Fidl) Margot Leverett (Clarinet) Itzhak Perlman's "Live in the Fiddlers House", Merlin Shepherd (Clarinet)
- 6. **Radio 365 and Radio@Netscape** have on-line free streaming klezmer stations (often including other forms of Jewish Music. NB, Errors in discography/titles have been noted)

SHEET MUSIC

Sheet music is of limited value. Try and listen as much as possible. Like most folk music, what's written down is only a guide or one person's interpretation. To get a feel for omamentation and phrasing listen repeatedly to the Old recordings or revival/traditionalist bands/recordings listed above at item 5.
